## Welcome to Mrs. Emmons's Algebra 1!

I would like to take a minute to introduce myself to you. My name is Angela Emmons and I will be your son's/daughter's Algebra 1 teacher. I am starting my 17<sup>th</sup> year of teaching all of which have been at LHS. I graduated from Louisville High School, received my Bachelor's degree in Integrated Mathematics (7-12) from Kent State University, and my Master's degree in Classroom Instruction from Ashland University. This year will be a bit different for me…in addition to the two Freshman Algebra 1 classes I will be teaching, I will also be teaching two classes of 7<sup>th</sup> Grade math at the middle school. I will be at the middle school in the morning and the high school in the afternoon. I am excited to begin this year with the hope of providing your child with a sound Algebra 1 base in a safe, relaxed, encouraging, and enjoyable atmosphere. Below are three things I'd like to emphasize regarding my class:

<u>COMMUNICATION</u>: I believe that one of the main components of a successful school year is communication, so please do not hesitate to contact me with any questions, comments, or concerns you may have.

- Remind (formerly Remind101) This is an app that allows me to keep parents (and students) updated on deadlines, upcoming tests/quizzes, or other important dates pertaining to my class.

**ISN (Interactive Student Notebook):** This year I will be using ISNs with my Algebra1 students. ISNs are a more structured, more organized, more meaningful way to take notes. The notes and accompanying examples/activities are strategically put into an ISN, while every-day practice, bell work, and other activities are put in a binder. Because of this, students will need BOTH a *college-ruled* composition book and a 3-ring binder (or a section in another binder they are using for all classes). A large supply of notebook paper will also be needed! <sup>(G)</sup>
